The October meeting featured lathe tool sharpening. Several members showed how they sharpen tools. Several jigs were demonstrated. Russ Blaser showed how he uses his "Glaser" jig. John Larson demonstrated using his belt sander/diamond wheel setup. There was a lot of audience participation with many good ideas being exchanged.

The December meeting's challenge was a homemade turning tool. Several members brought good examples.

Roger Fisher brought several scrapers he had made from files. He also gave some good tips on annealing steel. This prompted an audience discussion on steel heat-treating

techniques. Roger also brought some cute turned mushrooms made from tree limbs.

Norman Rechlin showed off some homemade faceplates. These were very inexpensively made but appeared to be very serviceable.

John Shackleford displayed a half-dozen lathe tools made from used nail gun drive pins. John could sell these well-made tools.

Richard McCartney brought a good-looking brush with a spalted wood handle. The handle had a leather "Made by Richard McCartney" insert that he had specially-made at Tandy Leather.

George Sharrar showed off a kaleidoscope that he was making for a Christmas present. I don't think that it was turned on a lathe but it was really interesting anyway.

Boyko Varney has been busy trying to learn the features of his new ornamental lathe. He brought the project that he made while he was being taught how to use the lathe. It was a beautiful ornamental box made from Morado wood. He also brought also brought a Christmas tree ornament that he made on his own.

Chuck Carnahan displayed two nice largediameter plates that he recently made. The first plate was made from 2" purpleheart and had a wavy surface. The second plate was made from padauk and featured lapis stone inlay. Both plates had black palm lips.
