## The April Meeting

The next meeting will be held at 7:00 PM, April 14th, at the Woodcraft Supply store in Lenexa.

This month's meeting will feature a discussion on wood toxicity. Probably most woods are toxic to some extent. Toxicity is the tree's defense against hungry insects or animals. Most toxic substances are in the tree's leaves, bark and sapwood. Sometimes the heartwood is also toxic, which can affect us woodturners. We will talk about which woods are toxic and what you can do about it.

We would like to get our membership's feedback on the KC Woodturners meetings of the past year. Do you like the meetings?
