On Wednesday, June 18th, the Kansas City Woodturners will host Soren Berger, former president of the New Zealand Woodturners Group and 3-times demonstrator at Dale Nish's symposium at Provo, Utah. Mr. Berger is in the United States on tour and is passing through Kansas City. We are extremely lucky to have arranged this special tour stop. The demo will be at the Woodcraft Supply Store from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with an hour off for lunch. Admission is free to Kansas City Woodturners and \$20.00 for others. Soren Berger will also be at the Utah Symposium again this year, demonstrating for Dale Nish.

The June Meeting

The next meeting will be held at 7:00 PM, Monday, June 9th, at the Woodcraft Supply store in Lenexa.

This month's meeting will feature a discussion on wood toxicity by our president, Roger Shepherd. Probably most woods are toxic to some extent. Toxicity is the tree's defense against hungry insects or animals. Most toxic substances are in the tree's leaves, bark and sapwood. Sometimes the heartwood is also toxic, which can affect us woodturners. We will talk about which woods are toxic and what you can do about it.

The KC Woodturners got a special deal from Farris Machinery for our June raffle. We have **three** \$125 *Turning Point Workshop* registration fees to raffle off at this \$5.00-per-chance raffle. 
Videos and Magazines
