Anthony gave us details on the wooden hatmaker, crotch turner, top maker and instant gallery. **Duton Biggs** also gave his two cents on the AAW Symposium. They both recommended the event.

Show and Tell

Pete Stiglich showed us a very nice brass plumb bob with turned wooden display stand he recently made. They were very similar to the Bridge City Tools edition. Good job, Pete!

George "Sonny" Sharrar brought a good-looking segmented walnut bowl with an intricate chain-design central ring. Sonny also brought a protractor he made for segmented bowl work that featured a vernier scale accurate to within 1/8th degree.

Russ Blaser brought two turned projects that didn't turn out like he wanted. They came off the lathe as beautiful walnut and eucalyptus burl hollow vessels but soon warped beyond redemption. These were examples of what can sometimes happen to even the best projects.

Boyko Varney showed off two outstanding mahogany bowls he made on his new ornamental lathe. Varney is really getting the hang of his lathe and is starting to experiment with it. We hope to get Varney to give us a demonstration of his ornamental lathe at a future meeting.

Anthony Harris brought a nicely-turned box elder wood bowl. He said that his bowl's lip would have been called "severe" at the recent AAW Symposium's Instant Gallery, but it looked pretty normal to us at the meeting.

Dan Marino exhibited his "woodturner's nightmare", which was a large cottonwood bowl that had exploded on the lathe. Hope the next one stays together.

Earl Reed showed off a very nice segmented cardinal wood bowl that he just completed. Earl is getting good at compound mitering wood segments for bowls.

Kevin Neellev brought two tall segmented vases that were not quite finished in time for the meeting. Both were made from bubinga. The first vase had an amboyna burl central ring and the second had a black palm central ring. Both had compound-mitered segment construction.

New Videos: Russ Blaser has now received the set of Nick Cook woodturning videos has been trying to get from England for the last several months. They will be available


