The May Meeting

Kansas City

The next meeting will be held at 7:00 PM, Monday, **May 11th**, at Consolidated Lumber and Millwork in Merriam, KS. Please park at the <u>front or side</u> of the building, outside the gates, because the gates will be locked later.

Many of you will remember the February meeting that featured Jeff Winkler of Seals, Inc. of Lenexa, KS. Jeff talked about his company's cryogenic process for increasing tool durability and edge wear resistance. Anyway, KC Woodturner member **Anthony Harris** has volunteered to take a load of tools (and any other items) to Seals, Inc., for cryogenic treatment. Any member interested in this process should bring their tools to the May meeting. The price is \$10 per pound. The tools should be marked with the owner's name. Thanks Anthony!

Thanks to KC Woodturner member **Pete Stiglich**, who made a 1" to 1-1/4" headstock thread adapter for our lathe. Now our wood lathe can use 1" and 1-1/4" chucks and faceplates for demonstrations.

Last Meeting

The April meeting featured a discussion by KC Woodturner member **Chuck Carnahan** on how to inlay crushed stone in woodturnings. Chuck's signature style is to inlay semiprecious stone, such as turquoise and malachite, in his turnings.

Selection of the two Kansas City Woodturners entries for the **12th Annual AAW Symposium and National Exhibition of AAW Chapters** was made by Consolidated Lumber employee Tom Elmer. Many members submitted some of their best projects for consideration. All entries were excellent and would have been fine representations of the KC Woodturners skills. The chosen turnings were made by **Rodger Lambie** and **Kevin Neelley**. Rodger submitted a well-shaped hollow turning made from finely-figured walnut crotch. Kevin Neelley submitted a whimsical segmented turning, in the shape of a genie bottle, made from red oak and padauk. Congratulations to Rodger and Kevin.

Show and Tell

Rodger Lambie brought two new pieces to show off. The first was a very nice segmented bowl made from chechem, redheart and maple burl. Rodger's second piece was selected for the National Exhibition of AAW Chapters, as mentioned above. It was a walnut crotch hollow-turning.

Russ Blaser displayed his newly-turned good-looking natural-edged elm bowl with a very small opening.

Roderick Strahm showed off two new projects. The first was a nicely-shaped small bowl made from figured maple. The second was beautiful large cherry bowl.

Anthony Harris also brought several projects. The first was a well-designed large oak bowl with straight vertical sides. The other two pieces were very nice small oak footed bowls.

Dan Bryan displayed a well-turned tall walnut goblet with a wooden ring on the stem. He also brought a fine redwood lace bowl with a very small opening.

Boyko Varney brought another good example from his ornamental lathe. Varney constructed a platter, made from pela maria wood, that featured a central ornamental design and blue quartz inlay.

Kevin Neelley had two new pieces to show off. The first was a segmented bowl made from padauk and local curly red oak. Kevin's second piece was selected for the

National Exhibition of AAW Chapters, as mentioned above. It was segmented vase in the shape of a genie bottle.

Dennis Liggett brought a beautiful laminated, spiral-stemmed goblet. Dennis did a good job on this extremely difficult turning. He also explained some of the steps he used in creating it.

Sandy Moreno showed off her first try at lathe turning. She made a very nice small bowl made from spalted figured maple. Good job!

Dan Moreno brought two new pieces. The first was a small well-turned naturaledged bowl made from chocte-vega wood (I have no idea how to spell this). The second was a good-looking bowl made from desert ironwood. Dan says that desert ironwood is just as hard as the name sounds - he broke two tools turning the piece.
