## The September Meeting

### Last Meeting

The August meeting featured Jeff Farris of Farris Machinery, who gave a fine demonstration on tool sharpening and woodturning. Jeff was a very enthusiatic demonstrator who probably would have turned far into the night if he had an audience. #### Show and Tell

**Boyko Varney** brought a beautiful lidded box made from redwood lace burl and wenge. Varney cut a Southwestern pattern in the bowl bottom using his ornamental lathe. He then filled the pattern with colorful epoxy inlay.

**Don Grimes** showed off several well-done new lathe projects. Don had several small lidded boxes and some small cups. The turnings were made from exotic lumber, such as dogwood and ironwood. These would make great Christmas presents.

**Bob Wickstrom** displayed an assortment of small magnets that he recently purchased. Bob started a nice discussion on the uses of such things in the woodshop.

**Chris Kunzle** brought in a new type of tool rest that he purchased for his VB30 woodlathe. This toolrest provides a lot more support for large hollowing tools.

**John Shackelford** showed off two very nice new turnings that were made with his new Mighty Midget lathe tool. Both turnings were made from spalted hackberry. The first was a large hollow vessel with a very small top hole. The second was a medium-sized John Jordan style vase.

**Anthony Harris** brought numerous projects to the show and tell. The first pieces were two small lidded boxes made from maple. Anthony also brought a small maple goblet. Next on the list were several really cute baby tooth boxes made from bloodwood. Lastly, Anthony had a well-turned large bowl made from spalted hackberry.

**Don Gruis** also displayed numerous new turning projects. The first three were nice small bowls made from redbud, mesquite and cherry. Next was a bowl made from Texas black walnut that Don said was "like turning a boiled egg". Last was a good-looking cherry bowl.
