November Show and Tell John Larson gave us tips to heat the shop with radiant heat. He had some printed material on this topic. Don Guris made a kaleidoscope of Cedar and boxes from Box Elder wood. Each of the items that he shared with us was finished with 1/3 each of Varnish/Turpine/Tung Oil. Bob Davis showed his French Rolling Pin (or commonly referred to as "HAT" [husband alignment tool]) out of Cherry, a top with a retractable string and a ring box that challenged everyone to figure out how to open it. Bill Coomer brought a bowl made from Blood Wood and put a Mylands Friction Polish on it.

Hands on demo

We were a given a demo by Varney on the use of the Partingtool. Some members with guts participated and tried it themselves.

Tip of the month

When you are turning a very thin-walled bowl you sometimes get trouble with chatter and vibrations and it is difficult to get a clean inside cut.

First turn and finish the outside of the bowl. Then wrap some strong tape round the outside rim and down the sides before turning the inside. The tape stabilizes the piece and avoids irritating chatter, making the finishing cut much easier to do. Reprint from:
