Bob Davis has been practicing on urn shapes for a collaborative turning he will be doing later. A very nice shape was displayed. He also showed a hollow vessel where he had used the Jamison System to get the final result of a nicely done piece.

Now, Jerry Darter's squirrel thumping tomato decoy was a real piece of art. Made to resemble a tomato on a stick, it was a "smash" with the group. On the more serious side of Jerry, he turned a Hard Maple and Redheart project. A nice example of turning.

Dan Moreno shared a framed piece of Spruce that had been carbon dated to 2200 BC. The trees had been discovered in the northern foothills of Alberta Canada, covered with soil. Also, a very nice natural edge Chatke Vega bowl was shown.

Chris Kunzle's mystery tools have been identified as a timberframing tools. It was intended to clean out corners of mortise holes.

Bill Coomer brought in a unique tool grind he has run across. A 3 ½" side grind that was used by a production turner. Thanks Bill for showing us this unusual grind.
