#### JUNE'S SHOW AND TELL

**Don Gruis** finished an Alex throw-away from the tool show as well as an example of how not to sand. Bob Davis shared martini glasses and reverse mold and turn item. Kevin Neelev shared a 12" x 12" x 6" Maple burl bowl with a Bloodwood base consisting of a 60 segment rim. Anthony Harris shared a nested lidded container set, chess pieces from blackwood (3/4" tournament size) a wooded business card holder (round) and a plastic lidded container made from rod stock (he has more of this plastic to sell). Tracy McCarty shared 2 pc of redwood finials, a baluster for the Jazz district made from poplar and a spindle for a church.

Dick Woodhouse shared a cedar spindle which maxed out the length of his lathe and challenged him on spindle turning techniques. Jerry Darter shared a baby rattle with a pinto bean inside and boiled thin wall oak bowl. John Shackelford shared a homemade chuck made from plastic compression-fittings that could hold a sphere or similar item.
