June Meeting Woodturning Demonstration





Our own KCWT member Don Gruis will talk about segmented woodturning. He has made some very beautiful segmented woodturnings and brought them to share with us at the club's "show and tell". Don will tell you that if you ask ten segmented woodturners the same question, you'll get ten different answers. This is your chance to find out Don's methods.

Don will talk about every stage of construction of his compound-mitered segmented bowls. He will talk about cutting the segments, the best glue to use, gluing the segments together into rings, adding veneer rings, flattening the top and bottom of the compoundmitered rings, and stacking the rings. Don has made four visual aids (photos below) showing the steps he uses. He leaves these at the clubhouse

If you are thinking about trying your hand at segmented woodturning, then don't miss the June meeting. Come with plenty of questions. You'll get plenty of answers.

Expect Don's demo to be informative and interesting to every level of woodturner.

Square-Cornered Bowl with Chip Siskey





Our own KCWT member Chip Siskey demonstrated how to turn a bowl with square corners. Chip also calls this technique the "lost wood" method. He showed how he started his turning with four blocks of wood, temporarily glued them together with scrap wood between the blocks, turned the outside and inside, removed the scrap pieces, then re-glued the four blocks. The result is a round bowl with corners as shown in the above photos.
