

May's Three Cornered Bowl Demonstration



Jim Faherty demonstrated how to create a three corner bowl at May's meeting. Starting with a square piece of wood, two opposite corners are flattened off for centering the cube on the lathe. Once on the lathe the Jim started turning the outside of the bowl. Since the piece of wood is not round, care needs to be taken when you start, half or more of your cut is in air until you get the



bowl shaped rounded to the corners. With a tenon on the bottom of the bowl the piece is reversed to a chuck. The outside shape of the bowl is



finalized. Care is taken when turning towards the top lip of the bowl because you are still cutting in the air. A bright light is advantages to see the wings of the bowl and the shadow of where you are turning. Once the outside shape is finished the interior is hollowed like other bowls. As you hollow the flat edges of the three sides are created from the flat surface of the original cube. The bowl was final reversed using a waste block backer and the foot is turned.

Saturday Learn to Turn Workshops



The education committee has been working on the Saturday Learn to Turn programs. The first program on the calendar this year was a tool sharpening. The program started at noon. Chip Siskey went over the basics of sharpening a variety of turning tools. Using an 8" grinder and a wolverine grinding jigs, Chip showed the participants the different angles and grinds for bowl and spindle gouges. Then he demonstrated his homemade jig on a belt sander for sharpening skews. After the showing us the basics, Ed and Chip showed a variety different jigs and adaptors including

Elsworth,

Tru-Grind, One-Way's skew grinding jig, Vari-Grind 2, a scraper burnisher and several shop made devices that they use in their shops to get the edge that they use when turning. After a informative demonstration, then came the hands-on. Four different grinder stations were set-up and the participants got a chance to try their hand on what they had just learned. Under the watchful eye of the instructors, class members tried their hand at putting the right edge on their tools.


