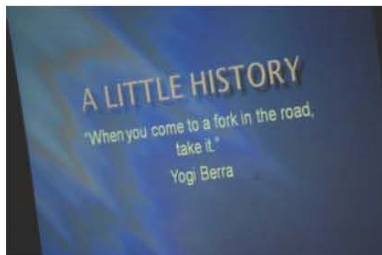


# Alan Carter Weekend

It started with him getting a degree in bass trombone - believe it, it's true. Well, what was your first field - before becoming a woodturner? After realizing that he might not make it where he wanted to go with music he worked in art for a number of years participating in the Plaza Art Fair a few times. Then it was furniture making which lead him to turning. His focus is on masking pieces of art and the medium be it trombone, painting, furniture, or woodturning is the vehicle which gets him to the end result. The medium of turning brought him to KC again.



He then spent the day demonstrating the processes he uses in making The split bowl vessels and the suspended vessels. He was able to complete both those with a little time left over so he also demonstrated how he made his thin stemmed goblets.



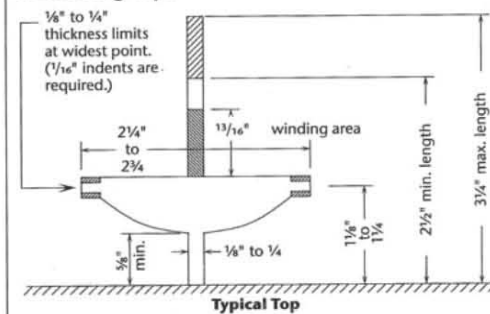

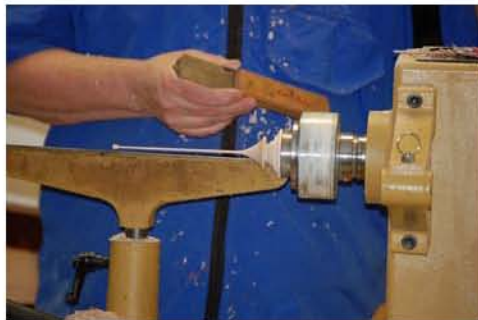

# DEMONSTRATION

This month's demonstration was provided by Mike Erickson and Larry Dice. They showed how to turn a very thin stem - mostly without use of the tailstock.



Make it round. Drill a very shallow hole in the end for the tenon of the cup which will be at the top. then start making very small, very slowly. Use whatever tool you are most comfortable with. Work carefully toward the headstock sanding as you go. When it is as long as you want and as thin as you want, make the base and part it off.
