

The General Noble Tree was a famous 19th century giant Sequoia who inhabited the Converse Basin area of Tulare County. Named for the Civil War general John Willock Noble, the record sized tree was cut down in 1893 for display at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago to show people how big sequoias were. They still didn't believe it. Today the sorry remains of the venerable big tree, known the "Chicago Stump," can be seen in the Sequoia National Forest (left).

She started by giving a history of her involvement with turning and getting started and developing her interests and techniques in surface decoration. She gets most of her inspiration from Nature as is highly evident in her work. She brought examples of her work and clearly demonstrated all the steps of her process. She uses a master Carver and Burner and, surprisingly, few tools.





























She had most of the attendees in the palm of her hand, wrapped in attention. If course there is generally someone who can't handle all the excitement. Others get distracted a bit.

















Sunday, Hands-On The day was totally devoted to following the process that Dixie had demonstrated on Saturday. The first thing that happened though was that a modification needed to be made to one of the bits being used. It needed to be flattened in order to make the perpendicular walls of the carving. Even the instructor can get a bit distracted by "Battle Tops." She learned something new that day as well.













After making the modification she demonstrated the process again. Making the drawing on the pieces of cherry prepared for the class by Kevin Neelley, everyone got to work. During that period of time, Dixie attended to everyone and gave one-to-one instruction. Everyone brought their own tools and for those who did not have the appropriate bits, she had some

Mike Thomas completed the bowl he brought to the demo, Jay Hansen a inlayed potpourri box, Rich McCartney a holder for a calculator, Don Gruis a platter almost damaged by a vacuum chuck, Richard Davis some bagged reverse turnings, and **Don Grimes** a plate finished using a vacuum chuck. The Challenge, for review, is generally based on the demonstration and it is to encourage members to push their skills, to try things they have not tried previously, to become more competent in a skill starting to develop.

Show and Tell - To continue with the review theme started above - Show

and Tell presents the opportunity for members to bring in anything that they are working on, in any stage of development of finish, to relate their successes as well as failures, and to ask for any help that they need to progress in what it is that they are doing. It is for EVERYONE.
