



### **November Demonstration**



Emerging Sphere and Bowl presented by KCWT member:
Brian Bartelli








During this month's demo, Brian showed how to make an emerging sphere and bowl. Tips and tricks were shared including unique ways to get the half sphere turned accurately.

#### Turning an Emerging Sphere

Here are a few key tips for turning an emerging sphere. Watch the video of the demo to learn more. The video can be found on the website

- Use a square blank
- Mark the center on two sides
- Mark 1/3 of the total width of the blank to remove
- Use a set of jumbo jaws setup as pictured to hold the blank.
- When you flip the blank, use spacer blocks as pictured.

### **Turning an Emerging Bowl**

When turning an emerging bowl, it is important to get the half sphere as accurate as possible. Brian demonstrated three different ways to increase accuracy when creating the half sphere


Watch the video for the full explanation of how to turn an emerging sphere, but included here are some pictures of the process used.





Pictured on this page are the steps to setup a template to turn the half sphere.

- 1. Cut the square blank in half.
- 2. Create a template with the half sphere cutout (Using a different color wood helps).
- 3. Glue the blank and template together.
- 4. Turn the blank down to the template.




#### Turning an Emerging Bowl Cont.

An additional method to turning an accurate half sphere is to use a sphere turning jig. Brian showed his homemade jig created from plywood (pictured on the right).

After you turn the half sphere, cut the blank in half and mount it on a turned scrap block. Brian used hot glue to mount the blank. Pictured on the bottom right is the blank mounted and shown in a very rough starting process of getting the blank turned to a finished state.

Key tip is to make sure the blank is mounted in true center of the bowl. Using the live center on the lathe will help with the process of lining up the blank.

\*Give it a try and bring your turned emerging piece to the Jan. meeting!


