Andrew explained his design process and some of the problems that always seem to crop up turning a 2D sketch into a 3D object. Some of his construction techniques involve woodturning but also bending, as shown in he photo at right.



It is always interesting to see what members bring to the Show and Tell. This time, turned items ranged from platters and bowls to morel mushrooms.




