Some questions are answered below:

How does my charity receive the donations?

Each quarter, the AmazonSmile Foundation makes donations to eligible charitable organizations by electronic funds transfer. Donations will be transferred approximately 45 days after the end of each calendar quarter. To account for product returns, a portion of the quarterly donations will be withheld until the next donation cycle, subject to any reduction due to returns from prior quarters. See the AmazonSmile Participation Agreement for more details.

How much of the customers' purchase price does Amazon donate?

The AmazonSmile Foundation will donate 0.5% of the purchase price from customers' eligible AmazonSmile purchases to the charitable organizations they select. <u>Title</u>: Boxwood Box on an Ebony Pedestal

Dimensions: 2-1/2" diameter sphere x 5" tall pedestal (7-1/2" total)



<u>Description</u>: The boxwood perfect sphere is hand-threaded to separate in the middle. The sphere is elevated using a delicate ebony pedestal that is also hand-threaded.

Woods Used: boxwood and ebony


