



<u>Title</u>: Bigleaf Maple Box with Carved Flower in

Dimensions: 4.35" diameter x 3.5" tall

Sue's Description: I made this box from big leaf maple with a carved flower in the lid. The flower is stained red mahogany and painted with a red iridescent paint to bring out the carving details. The stamens are sterling silver. My design came about from looking at the tenon on a box lid and thinking "That would make a great flower!"
