Dimensions: 11-1/2" tall x 2-1/2" diameter at widest point

Description: This fine Olive peppermill was made from vase was constructed from a beautiful piece of olive wood from the middle east. The peppermill features an ebony ball top. It has a very nice quality grinding mechanism installed. The wood was finished with walnut oil so is not glossy and feels very good in the hands.
