KC Woodturner Larry Dice demonstrated applying ornamental paint to platters

Larry has been a KC Woodturners club member for a number of years. He has also been a club officer. A couple years ago Larry donated one of his paint decorated platters to the Silent Art Auction and the bidders fought over it. The paint he uses is an Acrylic paint from Golden Fluid Acrylics called an "Interference" Acrylic which needs to have a dark background for it to show properly. He starts his paint decoration by spraying black rattlecan lacquer . Then he applies the Interference Acrylic and spreads it in an unusual way that can be found in most kitchens. Larry also uses a hairdryer for the purpose of time restraints. Finally, he uses a gloss spray lacquer as a topcoat. All of this can work be done in one hour or less depending on the drying time and the design of the platter/plate.

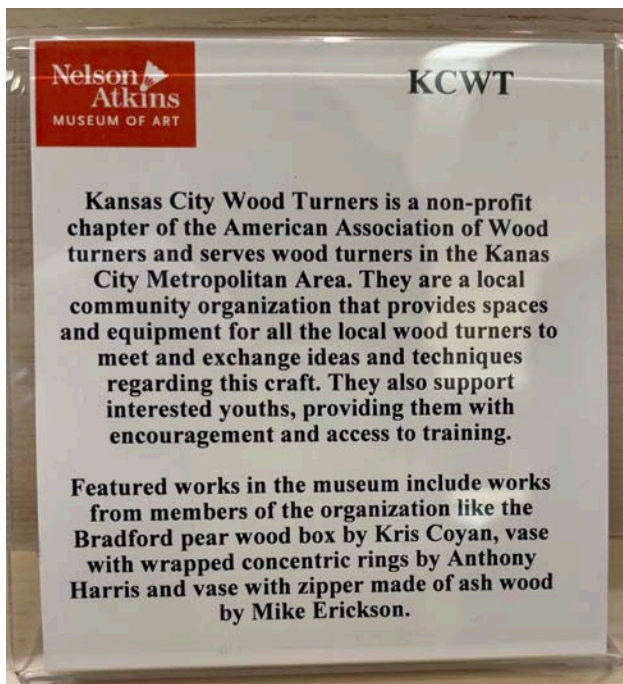
THE NELSON-ATKINS MUSEUM OF ART

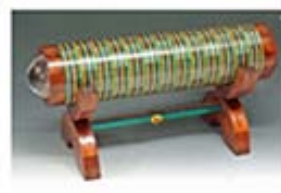

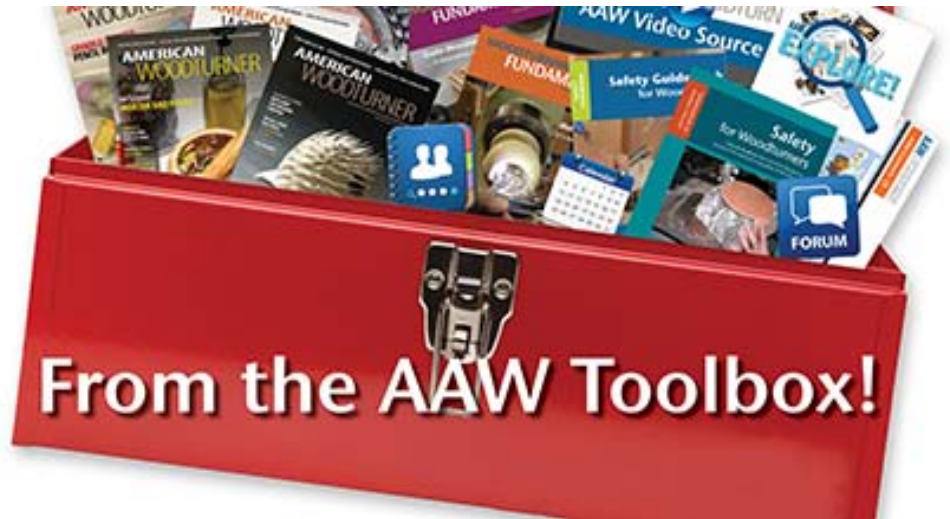

Presentation of Projects

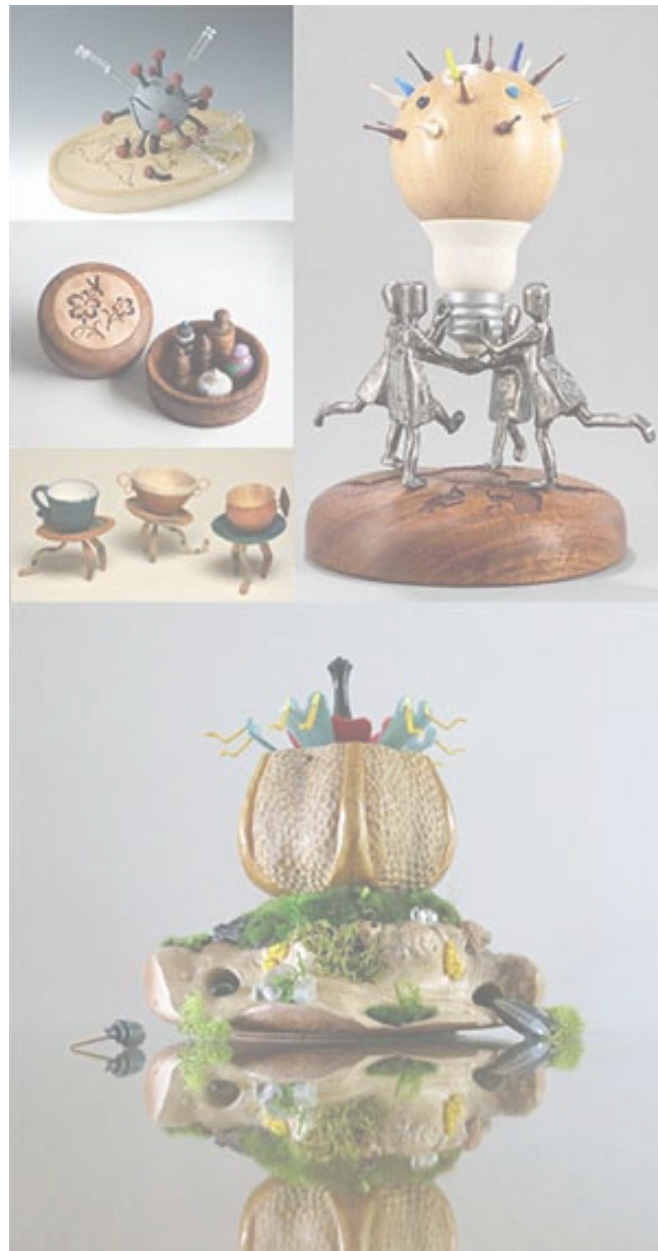
